



## **Montverde Academy Summer School 2010**

**Summer School will begin with registration on Sunday, June 20, 2010 from 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. Classes will begin on Monday, June 21, 2010. Summer school will conclude by 3:00 P.M. on Friday, July 16, 2010. Students departing before 3:00 P.M. will not be given course credit.**

**High School students may earn academic credit approved by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), Florida Council of Independent Schools (FCIS), and the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS). High School students may earn a maximum of 1 ½ credits during a 4 week summer session or ½ credit during a 2 week summer session.**

Montverde Academy has designed a well-balanced Summer School Program that allows students to learn, while enjoying the benefits of Central Florida. Only minutes from all the recreational wonders in Orlando, Montverde Academy offers students the opportunity to combine a Summer School experience with the recreational fun of theme parks, water parks, cultural exhibits, sporting events and much, much more.

The aims and objectives of the Montverde Academy Summer School are as follows:

1. To provide all students with the experience of campus and dormitory life while improving study habits and strengthening scholastic foundations.
2. To remediate credit for a course that is required for graduation.
3. To give college-bound students an opportunity to strengthen academic areas.
4. To take prerequisite course(s) for an Advanced Placement course offered in the fall.

The Academy does not solicit the enrollment of students who do not respect authority and who are unwilling to abide by the school rules. Applicants must be physically and mentally able to participate safely in school activities, with reasonable accommodations, if necessary.

## **General Information**

1. Students who are good citizens and possess good grades will be permitted to go home weekends, if they desire. There will be a fee for students who need transportation to and from the airport, and/or bus and train terminals.
2. Each class may include students in varying courses and levels. Students are given assignments and work independently; guided and assisted by the instructor.
3. The average weekly allowance for students is between \$35.00 and \$40.00. It is given out by the Business Office each Friday, during lunch or after school.
4. All students are expected to keep their rooms clean and orderly.
5. All students who board are expected to attend a weekly devotional service on Sunday.
6. Boarding students are provided with three meals a day in the dining hall (brunch and dinner on weekends). Day students will have lunch provided daily.
7. Classrooms, dining room, dormitories and library are air-conditioned.
8. Classes will end each Friday at 3:00 P.M. Students visiting home for the weekend may leave at that time. Students must return to campus by 6:00 P.M. Sunday. A variety of trips and activities will be planned for those remaining on campus.
9. Course offerings are subject to minimum enrollment.
10. Daily attendance is critical to academic success. Each day missed is the equivalent to one week of school. Students who miss class time risk losing credit for the course.
